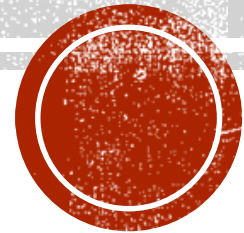

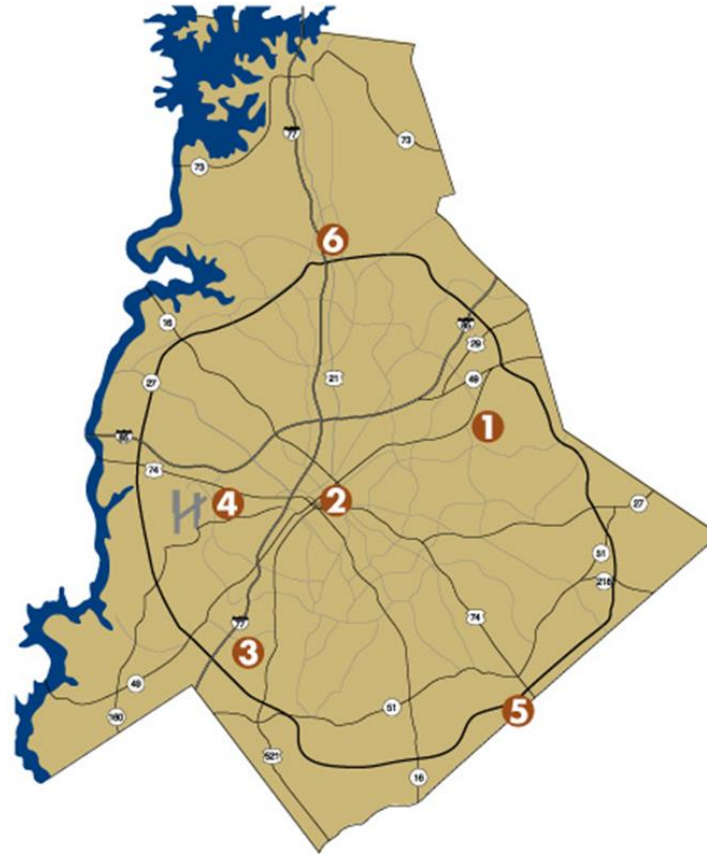

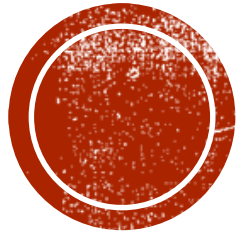

# CAREER & COLLEGE PROMISE PROGRAM

Career & College Promise (“CCP”) is North Carolina’s dual enrollment program for high school students.



This program allows eligible NC high school students to enroll in college classes at North Carolina community colleges while remaining at their assigned high school. Students who successfully complete college courses can earn college credit that can transfer to other post-secondary institutions after graduation from high school or receive certification or diploma in several career pathways.

This is different from the CMS Middle College Program.

# CCP AND BUTLER HIGH SCHOOL



- Career & College Promise affords Butler students the option to pursue dual enrollment classes at Central Piedmont Community College (CPCC) and choose from the following pathways – **AT NO COST**:
  - **College Transfer** - Designed for students planning to continue their educational career beyond high school to eventually achieve an Associate's or Bachelor's degree at a community college or university. To see how your courses from CPCC may transfer to YOUR 4-year college you should research the courses you wish to take prior to registration.
  - **Career & Technical Education** - Allows students to begin a certification or diploma program in a particular technical field or career area.



# CCP PAYMENT INFORMATION

- Tuition for CCP students is covered by the state of NC for Fall & Spring semesters
- Non-CMS students are responsible for student CAPS fee, insurance fees, & books
- CMS students are responsible for insurance fees & books
- Talk to your CDC about CMS-provided book vouchers (\$50 per course)
- Students are emailed when bills are posted, please be aware that the cost of tuition, taxes, and fees are covered at full cost for the Fall and Spring terms. Summer you will be responsible for the full cost of taxes, fess and books.



## College Transfer Pathways Only:

Demonstrate college readiness by achieving the required scores on a single test or by combining test scores in the areas of English, Reading and Mathematics from any of the approved assessments below:

\*To be eligible for enrollment in a College Transfer Pathway, students must demonstrate college readiness in English, Reading and Mathematics on an approved test or tests. Eligibility may be demonstrated by achieving the required scores on a single test or by combining test scores from any of the approved assessments.

\*Be aware that Butler can use discretion on the program requirements.

# ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

**To participate in the CPCC Career and College Promise (CCP) program at Butler High School applicants must:**

Be a rising Junior or Senior and on track for graduation

Hold a minimum 3.0 weighted GPA (Required for College Transfer; Recommended for Career & Technical Pathway)

Be able to provide own transportation to CPCC campus location





Students wishing to take the College Transfer Pathway but do not have the test scores to deem them eligible, may enter as a "Provisional Status" student.

**NOTE:** A Provisional Status Student can only register for college mathematics (MAT) and college English (ENG) courses within the chosen Pathway.

Courses you must pass before entering into full CCP student status: MAT 143, MAT 152, or MAT 171 AND ENG 111

## **ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS (CONT.)**

**Don't meet the test scores but still want to take College Transfer Courses??**

Provisional Status students must meet the following requirements:

- Hold a minimum 3.5 weighted GPA
- Complete Algebra II or higher with a C or better
- Complete 2 years of high school English with a C or better



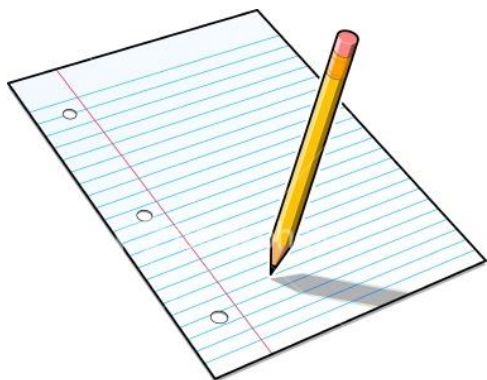


# SUMMER/FALL 2018 SCHEDULE



- Summer Term Dates: May 21 (1st 8-week, and 1st 4-week sessions)
- Fall Terms Dates: August 15 (Full 16-week, 1st 12-week, 1st 8-week, and 1st 4-week sessions)
- Short Sessions (8 weeks are available, however are not recommended for first time CCP students.
- All CCP students must follow the CPCC academic calendar for CPCC courses – you must attend your CPCC classes even if your HS is not in session!

- Are steps are required to be completed before April 28<sup>th</sup>. If all steps are not completed by this date you will not be able to register for courses on April 30.

You are applying to college through this process and will be held accountable for all necessary steps. **Each Semester/term you are required to reapply.**

**Summer/Fall Application 2<sup>nd</sup> Deadline: Monday, April 9, 2018** (Returning CCP Students will only need to complete Steps 1 and 2)

**Spring Application Deadline is TBD.**

STUDENT: By signing below, I understand (please check each item):

- I understand that, if I am an athlete wanting to attend college on an athletic scholarship, I must inform my counselor. We will need to discuss NCAA eligibility requirements.
- CPCC courses do begin building your college transcript and are added to your high school transcripts as elective courses.
- I am assuming the responsibilities of a college student.
- I must be a rising Junior or Senior on track for graduation & must meet all prerequisites for the pathway I choose.
- Summer courses are only available for rising Seniors.
- To maintain eligibility for continued enrollment, I must continue to make progress toward high school graduation and maintain a 2.0 GPA in college coursework after completing two courses.
- I will be responsible for insurance charges and other fees on select CPCC courses.
- Due to budget uncertainty, CMS students may be responsible to pay for textbooks and/or fees (summer courses).
- The grades I make at CPCC will be shared with my high school and included on my high school permanent transcript. CPCC grades earned will count as part of my high school "GPA" (Grade Point Average).
- I must attend CPCC classes even on days when CMS is not in session.
- I realize that registration for fall and spring semester is a separate process.
- I will schedule CPCC classes that will not interfere with my Butler classes.
- If I take a CPCC class and receive early dismissal, I must leave campus when I am not scheduled for a CMS class.
- If required, I must properly sign out each day before leaving Butler campus.

- My CDC (Mrs. Beechle) is the only person who can approve a CPCC class withdrawal from a CPCC class.
- Failure to attend a CPCC class after the semester "Drop/Add Schedule Adjustment" period will result in a grade of "F" on my high school transcript and will be reflected in my high school GPA.
- If I receive an "I" (incomplete grade), an "N" (never attended) or a "W" (late withdrawal) from CPCC for a course, a grade of "F" may be recorded on my permanent high school transcript and be reflected in my high school GPA.

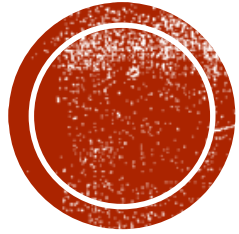

# PROGRAM POLICIES & INFORMATION

- All CCP students must submit required paperwork each semester during which you plan to take a class.
- CMS students need to meet with their CDC each semester to complete paperwork.
- You can only select CPCC classes from the approved list of Career and College Promise Courses that can be found at: <http://www.cpcc.edu/hsprograms/approved-academic-pathways>
- There is no guarantee you will get the course(s) you want at the campus you want.
- Attendance at CPCC classes is required
- You must follow [CPCC's academic calendar](#) in addition to the [CMS academic calendar](#). You will start school in the spring at least one week prior to the second semester of CMS. You might also be attending CPCC classes during CMS holidays, fall and spring break, and teacher workdays
- Students are responsible for their own transportation to and from CPCC. Butler students will not be given special consideration for a Butler parking spot because you are in the CPCC Program
- Students may not stay on the Butler Campus during their CCP Block(s)
- The grade(s) you receive from courses taken while enrolled in the CCP Program will count twice (once as a college credit and once as a high school credit)
- Course(s) listed on your high school transcript will be on a 5-point scale (similar to Advanced Placement courses)
- CPCC tuition is waived for CMS CCP students
- Due to budgetary constraints, students may be responsible for the cost of textbooks
- When available, students may receive a \$50.00 Barnes & Noble gift cards to help cover the cost of textbooks
- When applicable the student may be responsible for and additional costs of enrollment (e.g. student fees, insurance, etc.)





## Drops

- Doesn't appear on your transcript
- Must be done by the 10% date for the class
- Can be done on MyCollege

## Withdrawals

- Formally removes you from a course after the 10% mark
- Must be done prior to the 35% date of the class
- Appears as "W" on transcript

## Withdrawal=Fail

- You will received an "WF" on your CPCC transcript if you fail to attend or complete a course after the 35% date
- You will be awarded an "F" if you withdraw from a course late.
- It is recorded as an "F" on your CMS transcript

# HIGH SCHOOL TRANSCRIPT

- Courses at CPCC will count twice
  - High School Transcript (1 credit hour)
  - College Transcript (1-4 credit hours)
- Some courses will have high quality points
  - Similar to AP courses (1 additional quality point)
- You CAN complete a certificate in the area you select if you successfully complete all courses in your pathway prior to graduation,

# FAMILY EDUCATION RIGHTS & PRIVACY ACT (FERPA)

- Federal law that governs what student information can and cannot be shared with others
  - Even dropping or adding a course!
- Covered private educational records include:
  - Academic records
  - Accommodations
  - Disabilities
  - Class schedules
- We cannot **legally** provide this information to outside sources – *including your parents*
- Certain information & requests must be emailed from CPCC student account



# OTHER IMPORTANT ITEMS

- **Student ID Cards** can be picked up at any campus after you have registered for your classes. This ID will be necessary in order for you to navigate the building and utilize the on campus resources.
- **Parking Decals** can be picked up at Levine, you will need this so you do not risk the chance of getting towed!
- **CPCC Book Store** is where you will use your CMS issued book cards.
- **School Tours** are not required, however are recommended for students to find their way around campus.
- **Students may not always get the CLASSES they WANT at the CAMPUS they WANT.**
- **Academic Learning Centers, Workout Facilities, Disabilities Services, and Advising** are available to all CCP students.

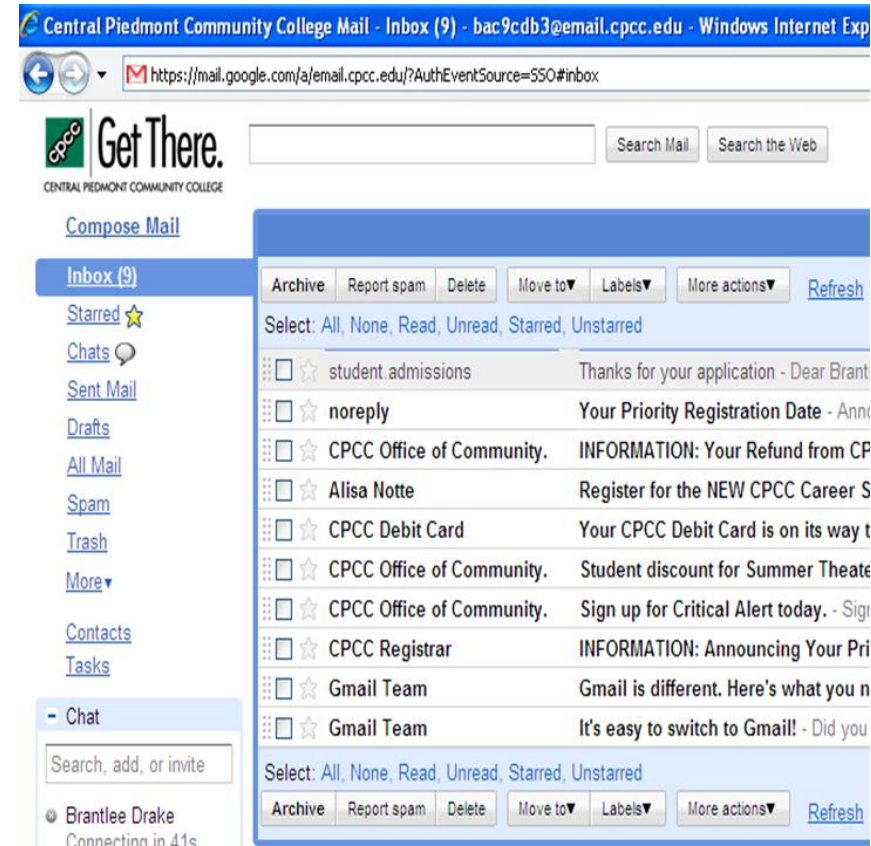

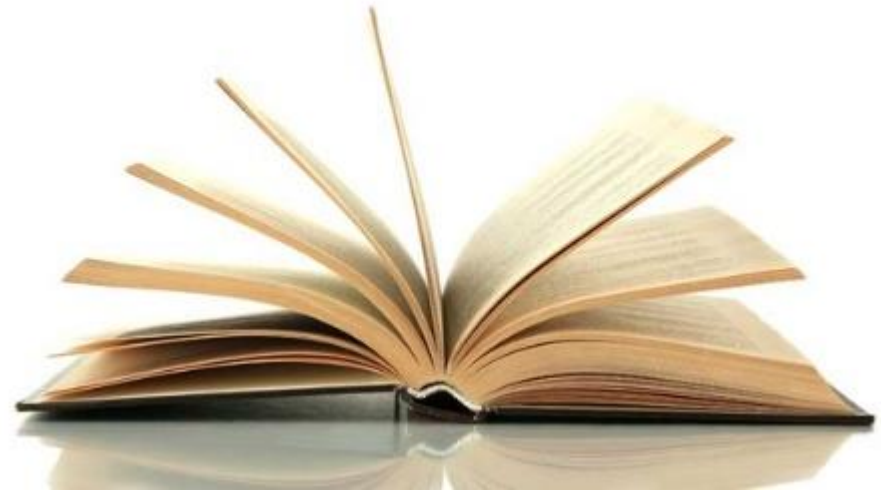
- Located at every campus

- Do not purchase books until you have attended at least one day of class

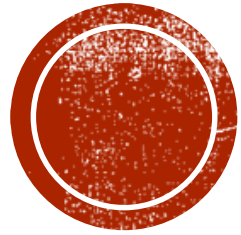
